2.2 Operate equipment using personal protective equipment.

Outcome 3

Maintain, clean, and store powered amenity machinery and equipment.

- 3.1 Carry out pre and post-use check and maintenance procedures.
- 3.2 Identify, record, and report maintenance.
- 3.3 Clean and store machinery and equipment.
- 3.4 Collect, treat, and dispose of or recycle waste generated by cleaning and maintenance procedures.
