- 1 The level of knowledge required in this unit standard is that of a broad, general nature which indicates an awareness of the purpose and function of systems and procedures rather than detailed content.
- 2 Definitions
CAA refers to the Civil Aviation Authority of New Zealand.
Safety procedures refer to a set of procedures and systems within an operational group to ensure consistency and safety during a process.
ICAO refers to the International Civil Aviation Organisation.
- 3 Legislation relevant to this unit standard includes the Civil Aviation Act 1990.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Demonstrate knowledge of civil aviation law.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 The ICAO is described in terms of its purpose, function and status.
- 1.2 The CAA is described in terms of its purpose, function structure and key accountabilities.
- 1.3 The Civil Aviation Act 1990 is described in terms of its structure.

Outcome 2

Demonstrate knowledge of aviation procedures and systems.

Performance criteria

2.1 Safety procedures in aviation are described in terms of their purpose and application by specific industry personnel.

Range air traffic controllers, pilots, flight attendants, maintenance personnel, airport ground staff.

2.2 Control systems which ensure aviation safety are described in terms of their purpose and application.

Range approvals and licensing; training; quality control and assurance; aircraft maintenance programmes; incident reporting and follow up; personnel selection and qualification requirements.
