

<b>Title</b>	<b>Deliver and spread base-course aggregates by truck</b>		
<b>Level</b>	<b>4</b>	<b>Credits</b>	<b>2</b>

<b>Purpose</b>	People credited with this unit standard are able to deliver base-course material to stockpile by truck and spread base-course material onto road surfaces by truck.
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<b>Classification</b>	Commercial Road Transport> Goods Service
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<b>Available grade</b>	Achieved
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<b>Prerequisites</b>	Candidates must hold a minimum of the class of licence required for the vehicle being driven and comply with the requirements of the Land Transport (Driver Licensing) Rule 1999.

- 3 Definitions  
*Industry best practice* means an industry accepted method of achieving a high standard of outcome that meets industry needs and represents value for money.  
*Organisational requirements* include any legal requirements, standards, codes of practice, organisational and/or site policies and procedures, industry best practice, and manufacturers' instructions. These must be available to candidates, providers, and assessors.

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### Outcomes and performance criteria

#### Outcome 1

Deliver base-course material to stockpile by truck.

**Performance criteria**

- 1.1 Base-course material is delivered onto the stockpile in accordance with delivery instructions, legal and organisational requirements.
- 1.2 Delivery is layered on the stockpile from alternate directions.

**Outcome 2**

Spread base-course material onto road surfaces by truck.

**Performance criteria**

- 2.1 Layers are spread to a thickness that meets customer requirements.
- 2.2 Load is spread from the starting point in accordance with customer and organisational requirements.
