  - Health and Safety at Work Act 2015; and any subsequent amendments and replacements.

## 5 Definitions

Company requirements refer to instructions to staff on policy and procedures that are available in the workplace. These requirements may include – company policies and procedures, work instructions, product quality specifications and legislative requirements.

Light 4WD vehicle refers to any four-wheel vehicle with a gross laden weight less than 3500kg and capable of having motive power applied simultaneously to all four wheels. It does not include an all-terrain vehicle.

Off-road means a surface other than a sealed or unsealed road or track and includes but is not limited to bush tracks, beaches, river beds and open paddocks.

# Outcomes and performance criteria

#### **Outcome 1**

Develop a plan for off-road light 4WD vehicle driving.

# Performance criteria

- 1.1 A route plan is developed that is consistent with the characteristics and capabilities of light 4WD vehicles and is within drivers' abilities.
- 1.2 Environmental conditions confirmed as suitable for the journey are included in the plan, and actions taken to manage them are identified.
- 1.3 Communication and safety factors are included in the plan.
- 1.4 Vehicle equipment to be inspected for condition and suitability for the journey is included in the plan.
