- 2 Definitions

Hand tools refer to manually operated tools. These may include measuring tapes, pencil, hammer, punches, squared, saws, bevels, chisels, planes, drills, screwdrivers, dividers, levels, gauges, spanners, pliers, snips, chalk and string, sanding block, files, vices, needles, awl, bradawl, marlinspike, scissors, sailmakers palm, hacksaw, grommet set, verniers.

Job specification refers to the standard requirements of the job being undertaken.

Workplace policies and procedures refer to the documented procedures and policies providing guidelines of the tasks and activities carried out in the workplace. This typically includes relevant health and safety requirements to manage risk in the workplace.

Outcome 1

Select and use hand tools to complete tasks in the marine or composite industry.

Performance criteria

1.1 Hand tools are selected in accordance with job specification.

1.2 Hand tools are used to meet the job specification.

Outcome 2

Care for hand tools in the marine or composite industry.

Performance criteria

2.1 Hand tools which are faulty, or in need of repair or maintenance are identified and corrective actions taken in accordance with workplace policies and procedures.

2.2 Hand tools are cleaned, serviced, and stored in accordance with workplace policies and procedures.
