- 1 Definition
Workplace policies and procedures refer to the documented procedures and policies for providing guidelines of the tasks and activities carried out in the workplace. This typically includes relevant health and safety requirements to manage risk in the workplace.
- 2 All work practice must meet recognised codes of practice and workplace policies and procedures for personal, product, and workplace health and safety, and must meet the obligations required under the Health and Safety at Work Act 2015, Resource Management Act 1991, and any subsequent amendments.
- 3 Range
portable power tools may include but are not limited to – saws, planer, drill, sanders, grinders, nail gun, brushes, buffs, wrenches, jacks, hammers, routers, electric scissors, electric rotary cutter, ferrule puncher, heat gun, hot knife, jig saw; evidence of five portable power tools is required.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Select and use portable power tools relevant to the task.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Portable power tools are selected in accordance with job specification.
- 1.2 Portable power tools are used in accordance with manufacturer's recommendations and workplace policies and procedures.

Outcome 2

Care for portable power tools used in the marine or composites industry.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Portable power tools which are unsafe, faulty, or in need of repair or maintenance are identified and corrective actions taken in accordance with workplace policies and procedures.
- 2.2 Portable power tools are cleaned, serviced, maintained, and stored in accordance with workplace policies and procedures.
