

Title	Supervise jackpot systems for gaming machines in a Class 4 gambling environment

Purpose	People credited with this unit standard are able to: describe jackpot systems associated with gaming machines; demonstrate knowledge of the regulatory requirements related to jackpot systems; and supervise the operation of jackpot systems in a Class 4 gambling environment.

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Explanatory notes

- Definitions

Class 4 – the category of gambling defined in the Gambling Act 2003.

Establishment requirements – any policy, procedure, or agreed requirement, either written or oral that are made known to the candidate prior to assessment against this unit standard.

Gaming machine – as defined in the Gambling Act 2003.

Operating manual – the instruction booklet or other printed material supplied by the equipment manufacturer, distributor or supplier.

Game Rules – those prescribed in Game Rules 2016, pursuant to the Gambling Act 2003.

Walk-away – refers to situations where a jackpot is struck and the player is no longer present at the machine.
- Any relevant Acts, regulations, and bylaws must be complied with during assessment against this standard.

Outcomes and evidence requirements

Outcome 1

Describe jackpot systems associated with gaming machines in a Class 4 gambling environment.

Range jackpot systems – stand-alone, linked, mystery, progressive (symbol driven);
evidence is required for a minimum of three different types of jackpot systems.

Evidence requirements

- 1.1 Jackpot systems are described in terms of their distinguishing characteristics.

- 1.2 Jackpot systems are described in terms of their prize levels and the effects on the calculation of gaming machine proceeds.

Outcome 2

Demonstrate knowledge of the regulatory requirements related to jackpot systems in a Class 4 gambling environment.

Evidence requirements

- 2.1 Requirements for the provision and operation of a jackpot system are described in accordance with Game Rules.
- 2.2 Regulatory requirements for record keeping related to jackpot systems are described in accordance with Game Rules.

Outcome 3

Supervise the operation of jackpot systems in a Class 4 gambling environment.

Evidence requirements

- 3.1 Jackpot prize payments are processed in accordance with Game Rules, the operating manual, and establishment requirements.
- 3.2 Meter readings and other applicable information necessary for the completion of reports are recorded in accordance with the nature and type of jackpot equipment and Game Rules.
- Range may include but is not limited to – Daily Jackpot Cancelled Credit Report, Daily Jackpot Turnover Report, Weekly Jackpot System Analysis.
- 3.3 Documentation applicable to the jackpot system in use is completed in accordance with Game Rules.
- 3.4 'Walk-away' situations are dealt with in accordance with Game Rules.
- 3.5 Action taken in cases of identified jackpot system malfunction is in accordance with the operating manual and Game Rules.
