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### Explanatory notes

#### Glossary

*Mātauranga Māori* is inclusive of all ages and is whānau supported, modelled and monitored. It is within this context that this unit standard has been developed for Māori adults.

The term *Māori* is used generically, but with caution to avoid maintaining or perpetuating stereotypes and homogenous approaches to Māori development.

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### Outcomes and evidence requirements

#### Outcome 1

Analyse best practice standards of Māori models for adult education and training.

#### Evidence requirements

- 1.1 Similarities and differences between overseas and national best practice standards are identified.
- 1.2 Māori models of best practice are identified.

#### Outcome 2

Design and apply a Māori best practice model within a specific adult education and training setting.

#### Evidence requirements

- 2.1 Model of best practice is designed for a specific adult education and training setting.

- 2.2 Standards for evaluation of the model are set for a specific setting.
- 2.3 Best practice model is applied and evaluated against standards within the selected adult education and training setting.
