### 2 Definitions

Draft may refer to sketches, plans, drawings, digitally generated material.

Tau/taura refers to whiri cord attachments.

*Te Whare Pora* – a house or place that is set aside to teach and conserve the art of weaving.

Traditional refers to pre-1945.

- 3 Demonstrate proficient skills to tāniko tāpeka will be evidenced through:
  - a detailed explanation of tāniko whakapapa and usage;
  - detailed description of the stages of drafting tāniko tāpeka and preparing the materials to produce tāpeka;
  - an even and balanced tāniko pattern;
  - completed tāniko tāpeka tension is consistent;
  - an even and balanced tau, with secured ends.

- 4 Demonstrate comprehensive skills to tāniko tāpeka will be evidenced through:
  - comprehensive explanation of tāniko whakapapa and usage;
  - comprehensive description of the stages of drafting tāniko tātua and preparing the materials to produce tātua;
  - no gaps and no distortion within tāniko rows and pattern;
  - completed tāniko tāpeka is of an exceptional standard;
  - attached tau with tight whiri enhances overall design.
