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#### **Guidance Information**

1 Definitions

*Composition* refers to original compositions or arrangements of existing compositions.

*Features* refer to genre, notes, scale, range, tempo, harmony, musicians, terminology, kaupapa, variations, instruments, vocals.

*Fusion* or *fused* for this unit standard refers to a combination, union, mixture, blend, merge, meld of music from a range of time periods, or eras, into the late 20<sup>th</sup> and/or 21<sup>st</sup> century era.

*Kaupapa* for this unit standard refers to the theme, mood, and purpose of the new Māori music.

*Māori artist* refers to a recognised individual artist or group, of Māori descent, that has contributed to the development of Māori music.

Music eras refers to the following time periods:

- World Wars I and II (e.g. Paraire Tomoana, Tuini Ngawai, Ratana Band);
- Post-war 1950s (e.g. dance bands, show bands, Tui Teka, Dalvanius Prime, Kiri Te Kanawa, Howard Morrison Quartet, Dennis Marsh);
- late 20th century (e.g. Herbs, Aotearoa, Black Cats, Mokai, Iwi);
- 21st century (e.g. Maisey Rika, Rob Ruha, Troy Kingi, Ria Hall).

*New Māori music* is a fusion of traditional Māori music with any other music genre. It has vast and dynamic vocal traditions, profound traditional Māori instrumental traditions (taonga pūoro), and performance. It incorporates vocal traditions of various devices available to composers for kaupapa Māori.

- 2 Demonstrate in-depth knowledge of historical influencing factors in the development of new Māori music will be evidenced through:
  - identifying and describing a significant environmental influence in the development of new Māori music,
  - identifying and describing a significant influence from any one of the sociological factors in the development of new Māori music.
- 3 Demonstrate comprehensive knowledge of historical influencing factors in the development of new Māori music will be evidenced through:
  - identifying and linking the environmental influence with specific changes and transformations in the development of new Māori music,
  - identifying and linking the influences from one sociological factor with specific changes and transformations in the development of new Māori music.
- 4 Referencing

All sources of information must be referenced. Referencing will prepare ākonga for academic writing.

### Outcome 2

Describe the performance and composition styles of Māori artists that contributed to the development of new Māori music.

### **Performance criteria**

- 2.1 Performance and composition styles of Māori artists from different eras are described in terms of their contribution to the development of new Māori music.
  - Range evidence of three Māori artists, each from a different era, is required.
