Purpose	This unit standard is for people working in a primary industry context. People credited with this unit standard are able to operate a motorcycle on rolling terrain under limited supervision.

Prerequisites	Unit 19053, Operate a motorcycle on flat terrain in the workplace under close supervision, or demonstrate equivalent skills and knowledge.

- 1 Legislation and regulations relevant to this unit standard includes but are not limited to the:
 - Health and Safety at Work Act 2015;
 - Land Transport (Driver Licensing) Rule 1999;
 - Land Transport (Road User) Rule 2004.

2 Definitions

Limited supervision refers to the operation of a motorcycle under the limited guidance of a supervisor who has the knowledge and experience to ensure that the rider is safe at all times.

Workplace procedures refer to the verbal or written instructions to staff on policies and procedures for use and safety of vehicles and machinery in the workplace.

- For the purposes of this unit standard, *rolling terrain* is defined as class D land under the Land Use Capability Classification, which comprises slopes between 16° and 20° (Rolling to strongly rolling). More detail is available from https://www.landcareresearch.co.nz/publications/books/luc.
- 4 For the training and assessment of competency, operation of a motorcycle must not exceed a 20° slope.
- 5 Assessment
 - During assessment, manufacturer's recommendations and legislative requirements for the minimum age of a person driving a motorcycle must be complied with.

- The motorcycle must be specifically manufactured for rural workplace or off-road use. The motorcycle must have the following features – knobbly tyres, 2 wheels, gears.
- Candidates must be wearing a helmet suitable for the activity that either complies with the All Terrain Vehicle helmet standard (NZS 8600:2002) or is a motorcycle helmet of a standard specified in the Land Transport (Road User) Rule 2004.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Operate a motorcycle on rolling terrain under limited supervision.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Identify hazards in operating a motorcycle and describe the potential risks of harm or illness to people.
 - Range evidence is required for at least five hazards.
- 1.2 Identify control measures to eliminate or minimise health and safety risks.
- 1.3 Plan the route in accordance with the terrain and weather conditions.
- 1.4 Maintain control of the motorcycle at all times, appropriate to the conditions and minimising damage to self, others and property.
 - Range steering, braking, balance, gear selections, manoeuvring, change of surface.
- 1.5 Demonstrate active riding techniques while riding over rolling terrain.
 - Range weight transfer, stability, balance, body position, head and eye position.
- 1.6 Maintain traction in difficult situations and recover where loss of traction occurs.
 - Range difficult situations may include but are not limited to uphill, downhill, traversing a slope, wet conditions, loose surface conditions, rough terrain; evidence of five difficult situations is required.
- 1.7 Recover motorcycle from a failed hill climb.
- 1.8 Park motorcycle in a stable position, and report or fix any faults in accordance with workplace procedures.
- 1.9 Report and/or record accidents or near misses.
- 1.10 Follow instructions and consistently demonstrate safe riding that complies with safety requirements.
