Guidance Information

- 1 Legislation and regulations relevant to this unit standard includes but are not limited to the:
 - Health and Safety at Work Act 2015;
 - Land Transport (Driver Licensing) Rule 1999;
 - Land Transport (Road User) Rule 2004.
- 2 Definitions

Limited supervision refers to the operation of a motorcycle under the limited guidance of a supervisor who has the knowledge and experience to ensure that the rider is safe at all times.

Mounted equipment or a load refers to equipment which is loaded onto a motorcycle or attached to a motorcycle on carry racks. For assessment against this unit standard, the size of the load must be significant enough to affect the candidate's riding technique. Examples of loads are – a pillion passenger, a dog, bags of seed or fertiliser. If a pillion passenger is carried then the motorcycle must be equipped with foot pegs for the passenger.

3 For the purposes of this unit standard, learner training and assessment of competency for the operation of a motorcycle on rolling terrain must not exceed a 20° slope.

- 4 Assessment
 - During assessment, manufacturer's recommendations and legislative requirements for the minimum age of a person driving a motorcycle must be complied with.
 - The motorcycle must be specifically manufactured for rural workplace or off-road use. The motorcycle must have the following features knobbly tyres, 2 wheels, gears.
 - Candidates must be wearing a helmet suitable for the activity that either complies with the All Terrain Vehicle helmet standard (NZS 8600:2002) or is a motorcycle helmet approved by New Zealand government regulation.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Operate a motorcycle with mounted equipment or a load under limited supervision.

Performance criteria

1.1 Identify hazards in operating a motorcycle and describe the potential risks of harm or illness to people.

Range evidence is required for at least five hazards.

- 1.2 Identify control measures to eliminate or minimise health and safety risks.
- 1.3 Plan the route in accordance with the terrain and weather conditions.
- 1.4 Secure and make stable mounted equipment or load on the motorcycle.
- 1.5 Control motorcycle at all times, appropriate to the conditions and minimising risk of damage to self, others and property.

Range steering, braking, manoeuvring, gear selection, change of surface.

- 1.6 Maintain stability of the motorcycle and the mounted equipment or load while riding and turning.
- 1.7 Demonstrate active riding techniques appropriate to the terrain and weather conditions.

Range weight transfer, stability, balance, body position, head and eye position.

- 1.8 Maintain traction in difficult situations and recover where loss of traction occurs.
 - Range situations may include but are not limited to uphill, downhill, traversing a slope, wet conditions, loose surface conditions, rough terrain; evidence of five difficult situations.
- 1.9 Report and/or record accidents or near misses.
- 1.10 Follow instructions and consistently demonstrate safe riding that complies with safety requirements.
