Outcome 1

Work a farm dog when handling stock.

Performance criteria

1.1 Work the dog in a manner which matches its type.

Range one of – heading, huntaway, yard, handy.

- 1.2 Work the dog without loss of contact or control in paddocks and yards.
- 1.3 Work the dog to move stock without causing them undue stress.

Outcome 2

Maintain the health and welfare of a farm dog.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Feed the dog a balanced, appetising, and sufficient diet in accordance with good hygiene, and which meets its nutritional requirements.
- 2.2 Provide the dog with sufficient clean water to meet its body's requirements.
- 2.3 Provide the dog with shelter which is hygienic, secure, and comfortable.
- 2.4 Provide the dog with sufficient exercise and care to enable healthy physical and behavioural development.
- 2.5 Provide the dog with sufficient parasite control to prevent discomfort or health risk to the animal.
- 2.6 Secure a dog safely on moving vehicle in accordance with regulatory and Code of Welfare requirements.

Outcome 3

Describe working dog registration requirements.

Performance criteria

3.1 Describe registration requirements for farm working dogs in accordance with regulatory requirements.
