Elements and performance criteria

Element 1

Set up and monitor a borderdyke irrigation system.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Irrigation system gates are set up in accordance with on-farm procedures, to maintain maximum water efficiency.
- 1.2 Irrigation system is monitored in accordance with on-farm procedures.

Element 2

Maintain a borderdyke irrigation system.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Malfunctions of dams and gates are recognised and reported in accordance with operating and on-farm procedures.
- 2.2 Maintenance of gates and sills is carried out in accordance with on-farm procedures and manufacturer's requirements.
