- 3 Definitions

On-farm procedures refer to the verbal or written instructions to staff on procedures for shearing operations.

Pen up – filling up the catching pen with sheep. Shed up – filling the shed with sheep. Tally – counting sheep.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Handle sheep in shed and yards for shearing.

Range shed up, pen up, tally.

Performance criteria

1.1 Maintain the flow of sheep in the shed without unnecessary delay, or injury, and with minimal stress to sheep.

- 1.2 Tally sheep and record in accordance with the on-farm system in use and without delaying shearers.
- 1.3 Handle sheep in such a manner that avoids injury or risk of injury to sheep or handler.
- 1.4 Handle sheep in a manner which avoids shed stain.

Outcome 2

Carry out board work during shearing.

Performance criteria

2.1 Carry out board work without leading to delays to other shearing operations and kept free of excess wool.

Outcome 3

Prepare wool for pressing as directed by a supervisor.

Performance criteria

- 3.1 Prepare fleeces to best advantage with minimal skirting in accordance with supervisor's instructions.
- 3.2 Sort oddments into appropriate fadges.
- 3.3 Prepare wool in a timely manner to prevent the build-up of excess wool.

Outcome 4

Press wool as directed by a supervisor.

Performance criteria

- 4.1 Prepare bales and label in accordance with on-farm procedures, and within given weight limits.
- 4.2 Maintain records in accordance with wool industry requirements and on farm procedures.
- 4.3 Carry out wool pressing efficiently and without risk to the operator or other personnel, and equipment.
