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Explanatory notes

1 Definitions

Adventure activity refers to a planned activity undertaken in a natural environment which involves some physical challenge.

Codes of practice refer to a documented set of recommended or preferred processes, actions or organisational structures to be applied in a given setting.

Operational plan refers to a plan reflecting different local conditions and the individual circumstances of the operation, which may include but are not limited to – operating conditions, trip or activity requirements, equipment, communications, emergency planning and procedures, environmental conditions.

2 *Regulated industry standards* refer to standards that can be measured against external quality management bodies, which include but are not limited to – Maritime New Zealand, Civil Aviation Authority, Qualmark, Ministry for Primary Industries, NZ Transport Agency, Green Globe New Zealand, OutdoorsMark.

3 Legal provisions relevant to this standard include but are not limited to – Health and Safety at Work (Adventure Activities) Regulations 2016, available at: www.legislation.govt.nz; CAA Rules Part 115, Adventure Aviation, and CAA Rules Part 105, Parachuting – Operating Rules, available at: www.caa.govt.nz; Maritime New Zealand Rules, available at: www.maritimenz.govt.nz.

Any relevant Acts, regulations, and bylaws must be complied with during assessment against this standard.

3 For the purpose of this unit standard an adventure activity may be an activity used by visitors to New Zealand, or by people travelling within or outside their own region of New Zealand, who do not specifically consider themselves tourists.
