### Performance criteria

- 2.1 Evaluate current industry techniques to maximise grass production through establishing or renovating equine pasture in terms of their effectiveness for situations.

Range destruction of previous vegetation, seed-bed preparation, nutrient provision, selection of seed type, timing and method of sowing, early utilisation, under sowing, harrowing in, rolling in.

- 2.2 Describe the reasons for undertaking pasture renewal or renovation in terms of the likely gains to the producer.
