### Special notes

- 1 All work practices must meet documented company safety requirements. The documented company safety requirements must meet the obligations of the Health and Safety in Employment Act 1992 and subsequent amendments.
- 2 **Definition**  
*company requirements* refer to instructions to staff on policy and procedures that are communicated in oral or written form. These requirements may include but are not limited to - manufacturers' procedures, company safety procedures, codes of practice and standards, and legislative requirements.

## Elements and performance criteria

### Element 1

Prepare spat-catching racks.

Range may include but is not limited to - posts, rails.

### Performance criteria

- 1.1 Fouling organisms are removed from racks in accordance with company requirements.
- 1.2 Racks requiring repair are identified in accordance with company requirements.
- 1.3 Racks are repaired in accordance with company requirements.
- 1.4 Safe work practices are used in accordance with company requirements.

### Element 2

Set out bundles on spat-catching racks.

### Performance criteria

- 2.1 Bundles are attached to racks in accordance with company requirements.  
  
Range method of attachment, position of attachment points, firmness of attachment, spacing between bundles.
- 2.2 Bundles are set out on racks in accordance with company throughput requirements.
- 2.3 Safe work practices are used in accordance with company requirements.

### Please note
