*Manufacturer's specifications* – product specifications set by the manufacture relating to the use, maintenance and care of a product such as a tool or piece of equipment.

# Outcomes and performance criteria

# Outcome 1

Identify worn and faulty handpiece components and use equipment safely.

#### Performance criteria

1.1 Strip, clean and reassemble a handpiece in accordance with manufacturer's specifications.

- 1.2 Identify worn and faulty handpiece components in accordance with the manufacturer's specifications.
- 1.3 Identify faulty comb beds in accordance with manufacturer's specifications.
- 1.4 Use equipment, gear and tools in a manner which avoids injury throughout the process.

# Outcome 2

Identify, check and run the shearing plant, and notify maintenance requirements.

# Performance criteria

2.1 Identify worn and faulty parts of the shearing plant in terms of their effects on safety and performance.

Range hook and eye, elbow cogs, cones, springs, elbow leathers.

2.2 Check and run the shearing plant prior to use, to determine safe operational performance.

Range drive cones, guts, guards, noise, spline drive.

2.3 Notify any maintenance requirements of the shearing plant to the shed owner in accordance with on-farm procedures or contractor's policy.
