Outcome 1

Prepare shearing blades for use.

Performance criteria

1.1 Safely check pulled back blades for manufacturing faults and imperfections.

Range faults and imperfections may include but are not limited to – burnt

spots, kinks, wobbles, straightness.

1.2 Select a top and bottom blade, and make cut outs

Range cockspur, knocker and driver;

evidence of two is required.

1.3 Set and adjust blades in accordance with personal and manufacture requirements.

Outcome 2

Sharpen, maintain and confirm sharpness of shearing blades.

Performance criteria

2.1 Carry out techniques of grinding and stoning to achieve desired bevel and edge.

Range grinding, stoning

2.2 Dress points, and ground and sharpen blades further in accordance with sheep variables.

Range sheep variables include wool type, fleece contamination,

temperature.

2.3 Install parts of the blade shear in accordance with personal, safety and manufactures requirements

Range parts may include but not limited to cockspur, driver, jockey,

knocker;

evidence of two parts is required.

- 2.4 Confirm blade sharpness in accordance with industry accepted test procedures.
- 2.5 Maintain blade sharpness with a stone between sheep as required.

Outcome 3

Store blade shears safely when not in use.

Performance criteria

3.1 Maintain safety of self and others when blade shears are not in use or during transportation.

Range safe storage methods may include but not limited to – blade

keeper, water pot, toolkit;

evidence of two safe storage methods are required.
