Contractor's policy – the verbal and written requirements for recording the tally. *On-farm procedures* – refer to the verbal or written instructions to staff on procedures for animal care, welfare, and management.

4 Assessment must be carried out in a shearing shed with a flow rate of a minimum of 1000 sheep per day.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Tally mobs of sheep and record the information.

Performance criteria

1.1 Sheep are tallied in accordance with the shed system in use.

1.2 The tally is recorded in accordance with on-farm procedures and contractor's policy.

Outcome 2

Pen up sheep for shearing and maintain the flow of sheep within the woolshed.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Maintain mob separation in accordance with on-farm procedures.
- 2.2 Identify and confirm mobs in accordance with on-farm procedures.
- 2.3 Move sheep using knowledge of sheep behavior.
- 2.4 Pen sheep to minimise the risk of smothering in accordance with animal welfare legislative requirements.

Range numbers, matching workflow.

- 2.5 Maintain the flow of the sheep within the shed to meet woolshed workflow.
- 2.6 Coordinate shearers' catching pens for cut-out in accordance with contractor's policy.
