Information on hazard controls for specific types of notifiable work may be obtained from Worksafe New Zealand at <u>http://www.worksafe.govt.nz</u>. *Permit* refers to any permit that addresses the protection of health, safety, the environment, and/or assets at infrastructure worksites.
