- 2 Definitions
Agamotu refers to Niue traditions and customs;
Fakaholoaga refers to the process by which something is learnt or knowledge is transmitted;
Maaga is any one of the 14 villages that the learner identifies with through either matrilineal or patrilineal lines, or self-identifies through acceptable fakaholoaga;
Moui Niue is Niue life;
Pulotu refers to Niue village or community recognised and/or appointed experts.

Outcome 1

Demonstrate knowledge of agamotu in moui Niue.

Range one custom traditionally practiced in each of – planting, fishing, harvesting, hunting.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 The traditional agamotu practices are identified and described.
 Range when, where, how, associated prayers.
- 1.2 Reasons for adopting these practices are identified and explained.
- 1.3 Any changes to the traditional agamotu practices are identified, and the reasons for the changes explained.
