- 2 Definitions
 - Fakaholoaga* refers to the process by which something is learnt or knowledge is transmitted;
 - Fono he tau takitaki* refers to a leaders meeting;
 - Fono lotu* refers to a church meeting;
 - Fono ekepule* refers to the assembly meeting;
 - Fono fuata* refers to a youth meeting;
 - Fono ikipule* or *tufono* refers to the cabinet meeting;
 - Fono komiti* refers to a committee meeting;
 - Fono komiti aoga* refers to a school committee meeting;
 - Fono ulu fakatonu* refers to a heads of department meeting;
 - Maaga* is any one of the 14 villages that the learner identifies with through either matrilineal or patrilineal lines, or self-identifies through acceptable fakaholoaga;
 - Protocols* refer to traditional and contemporary protocols;
 - Pulotu* refers to Niue village or community recognised and/or appointed experts.
