## 2 Definition

*Relevant instructions* – oral, written or electronically transmitted instructions issued to govern the performance of security tasks, duties, and responsibilities. These may be in the form of policies, procedures, manuals, directives, or legal and compliance requirements. They may relate to a particular assignment, organisation, site or operation of equipment.

## 3 Assessment range

If this standard is assessed off-job, the relevant instructions will be supplied in a simulated situation.

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## Outcomes and performance criteria

### Outcome 1

Describe security incidents and breaches.

Range evidence for at least three types of security incidents and three security breaches is required.

### Performance criteria

- 1.1 Describe the incident and breach with reference to indicators, causes, types, effects, and the security officer's responsibility.
- 1.2 Describe the response of the incident and breach in accordance with relevant instructions.

### Outcome 2

Respond to security incidents and breaches.

### Performance criteria

- 2.1 Report security incidents and breaches in accordance with relevant instructions.
- 2.2 Seek advice, information, and assistance as required to respond to security incidents and breaches in accordance with relevant instructions.
- 2.3 Take immediate action to minimise and/or contain damage to maintain personal safety in accordance with relevant instructions.
- 2.4 Implement follow-up procedures of security incidents and breaches as required and in accordance with relevant instructions.
- 2.5 Protect evidence, witnesses, crime scenes and other indications of breaches from interference in accordance with relevant instructions.

**Outcome 3**

Identify, observe, and process suspects.

**Performance criteria**

3.1 Identify suspects and suspicious behavior in accordance with relevant instructions.

Range suspicious behaviour – characteristics, modus operandi.

3.2 Maintain continuous surveillance of suspects in accordance with relevant instructions.

Range until it is evident that an offence has, or is likely to be committed, or that no offence will be committed.

3.3 Respond to suspicious activity in accordance with relevant instructions.

Range response may include – report, take no action, call for assistance, interviewing, defuse, withdrawal, calm, isolate suspects.

3.4 Conduct searches in accordance with the law.

Range searches include – suspects, property.

3.5 Identify, process and document evidence in accordance with relevant instructions.

3.6 Treat suspects in accordance with the law.

Range observation of suspects to prevent self-injury and injury to others, prevention of destruction of evidence.

**Outcome 4**

Report and record security incidents and breaches.

**Performance criteria**

4.1 Complete reports and records in approved format and process in accordance with relevant instructions.

Range documentation must be complete, concise, logically organised, factual, unambiguous, and clear to the target audience.
