Ko te whakatau kia mahi ngā tāngata e whai ana i tēnei paerewa i ngā paerewa mō te Reo Maori, ā, mō Tikanga hoki, kua rārangihia ki runga i te Rārangi Kōpaki o ngā Paerewa Aromatawai ki te kaupae 2, mā te whakaatu rānei i ngā pūkenga o te mātauranga ūrite ki taua kaupae.
- 2 Hei aromatawai i te paerewa nei, tērā e rerekē ai te whakaatu, te whakamārama rānei i ngā mahi – he kōrero-ā-waha, he whakaata, he tuhituhi, he whakaari, he waiata, he haka.
- 3 Mā te reo o te mana whenua anō e whakatau ko ngā whakamāramatanga kupu, tikanga rānei.
- 4 Ko ēnei ētahi o ngā ture e whai pānga ana ki tēnei paerewa, arā atu anō ētahi; Te Ture Pouhere Taonga 2014 (Heritage New Zealand Pouhere Taonga Act 2014) Te Ture Tiaki Rawa 1991 (Resource Management Act 1991), Te Ture Whenua Māori 1993, Te Ture Tiaki Taiao 1987 (Conservation Act 1987), Te Ture Kāwanatanga-ā-Rohe 2002 (Local Government Act 2002), me ngā panonitanga katoa.
- 4 Hei whakamārama

Identify and explain the relationships of iwi kē to wāhi tapu.

Range relationships may include but are not limited to archaeologists, landowners, government departments, and local authorities, developers, Māori from other iwi;
evidence must include local authorities and three other different relationships are required.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 The relationships of iwi kē to wāhi tapu are identified and explained in terms of their characteristics and nature.

- 1.2 The relationship of iwi kē groups to wāhi tapu are compared in terms of their different interests.
