 - New Zealand Standards 4242:2018 - Headstones and Cemetery Monuments; and any subsequent amendments.
- 2 Definitions

Monument installations procedures may vary according to size and design of monument, selection of material used, and engineering specifications as required.

Workplace procedures refer to instructions to staff on policy and procedures which are communicated in verbal or written form. These requirements may include but are not limited to – manufacturers' instructions, company safety requirements, and industry codes of practice and standards. Workplace procedures must include legislative requirements.
- 3 All evidence presented in this unit standard must be in accordance with workplace procedures.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Describe the installation of monuments in a cemetery.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Describe applicable legislation and workplace procedures.

Range	may include but is not limited to – monumental stonemasons' roles and duties; installation procedures; installation in a public place; care and maintenance; evidence of four is required.
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Outcome 2

Oversee the installation of monuments in a cemetery.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Issue permits for the installation of monuments to stonemasons.
- 2.2 Monitor monument installations to ensure they are completed correctly and safely.
- 2.3 Liaise with monumental stonemasons.
- 2.4 Identify problems arising during or after monument installations and notify the appropriate person.
- Range appropriate person may include but is not limited to – a supervisor, a foreperson or a leading hand, a monumental stonemason.
- 2.5 Identify potential and actual breaches of workplace, health and safety, and legislative requirements for monumental installation and take appropriate action.
