Outcome 1

Evidence requirements

- 1.1 The procedures for confirming the legislation requirements for the labelling of seafood product are met are described in accordance with company requirements.
- 1.2 The procedures for confirming the company specific requirements for the labelling of seafood product are met are described in accordance with company requirements.

- 1.3 The procedures for confirming the customer specific requirements for the labelling of seafood product are met are described in accordance with company requirements.

Outcome 2

Supervise the labelling of seafood product.

Evidence requirements

- 2.1 The label is confirmed as being accurate for the seafood product prior to operator use.
- Range may include but not limited to – size, adhesive, brand, colour, language.
- 2.2 The label information is confirmed as being legible and accurate for the seafood product and its intended market prior to operator use.
- 2.3 The label is confirmed as being applied correctly by the operator.
- 2.4 The recording and reporting requirements are completed in accordance with company requirements.
