Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Demonstrate knowledge of activities undertaken by resource recovery stakeholders in New Zealand.

Performance criteria

1.1 Activities undertaken by commercial recyclers are described.

Range the geographical extent of commercial recycling activities, the types of products recycled and the market for those products; recyclers include – key companies, scrap metal dealers, waste exchanges, secondhand dealers, used clothing outlets.

1.2 Activities undertaken by recovery and resource processing businesses are described.

Range the geographical extent of those activities, the types of resources recovered, the market for those resources.

1.3 Resource recovery activities are described in terms of products and services provided by ancillary organisations.

Range city or district council, regional council, central government, industry association, community association, partnership organisation, research organisation.

Outcome 2

Demonstrate knowledge of resource recovery information and incentives in New Zealand.

Performance criteria

2.1 Information sources are identified in relation to compliance.

Range legislation, regulations, codes of practice, guidelines.

2.2 Dissemination of information is described in terms of targets, types, and methods.

Range targets – householder, commercial business, children, territorial authority, consumer, local community;
types may include – written, aural, visual, media, activities;
methods may include – events, publications, media communications, community consultation;
evidence is required of one type and one method for each target.

2.3 Incentives are described in terms of targets, types, and behaviour change.

Range incentives – environmental business award, certification, competition, extended producer responsibility scheme, container deposit legislation, pricing, accords, events;
evidence is required of four different types of incentive.
