3 Glossary

Design refers to Māori performing arts kākahu design elements;

Design elements refers to the basic qualities (eg line, tone, texture, colour, shape, pattern, form or mass) of two and/or three-dimensional components;

Head-dress refers to ornaments for the head, such as tipare, raukura, heru;

Kākahu refers to all Māori performing arts regalia components, inclusive of applied whakarākei ā-tinana;

Kaupapa refers to the significance of the selection of design elements;

Meaning refers to the reasons for using chosen design elements;

Tikanga refers to culturally appropriate practices – kia tika te mau me te tiaki o ngā kākahu;

Whakakai refers to ornaments for the ear or neck.

4 Where applicable, ākonga are encouraged to reference. Referencing will prepare ākonga for academic writing.
