## 2 Definitions

Commercial fishing vessel refers to a vessel that is operating a Maritime Operator Safety System (MOSS) that is recognised by Maritime New Zealand and meets the requirements of the Maritime Transport Operator Certificate and/or Plan. Workplace procedures refer to the policies and procedures set out in a verbal or written form by the employer or organisation. Procedures must be consistent with current legislative requirements and manufacturer's recommendations or instructions where relevant.

## Performance criteria

2.1 Describe the roles and responsibilities of the members of the crew of the vessel.

Range may include but is not limited to – Skipper/Master, Mate/Chief Officer, Bosun, Factory Manager, Fishing Master, Engineer.

2.2 Describe the roles of people responsible for each area of the vessel.

Range bridge, deck, factory, engine room, living areas.

2.3 Describe the position the fisheries observer occupies in relation to the vessel hierarchy.

Describe preparations required for return from an extended trip at sea.

## Performance criteria

- 3.1 Describe the personal preparations required for return from an extended trip at sea.
- 3.2 Describe the job related preparations required for return from an extended trip at sea.
