- 3 Definitions

Company requirements refers to instructions to staff on policy and procedures that are available in the workplace. These requirements may include – company policies and procedures, work instructions, product quality specifications and legislative requirements.

Industry guidelines refers to those practices and procedures commonly used as standard procedures to produce items of acceptable merchantable quality in the industrial textile fabrication industry such as related textbook descriptors.

Manufacturer's information may include – technical information for a machine or product detailing operation; installation and servicing procedures; manufacturer instructions; technical terms and descriptions; and detailed illustrations.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Demonstrate knowledge of product packing procedures on completion of industrial textile fabric product work.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Requirements for quality checking the final product are described.
 - Range quality check may include – final measurement check against job specifications, seam and hem checks, flaws in the fabric, fasteners and fittings operate to manufacturer specifications, customer requirements; action to be taken in the event of non-compliance which may include – laying out or marking faults, cutting, stitching or finishing faults.
- 1.2 Materials used for packaging are identified.
- 1.3 Methods for packing workplace products are described.
 - Range freighted, delivery by company, picked up by customer.
- 1.4 Procedures for recording and labelling packages for dispatch are described.
 - Range labelling, user instructions, warranties, inspection checklists, dispatch documentation.
