1.3	Seams and	hems are visually checked.	
	Range	may include – width, evenness, type.	
1.4	Stitching is	checked and any faults are recorded.	
	Range	may include – stitch length, loose stitching, skipped stitches, loose threads.	
1.5	Accessories are checked.		
	Range	may include – eyelets, windows, pockets, tabs, zips, doors, attachments, ropes.	
1.6	Any defects	are reported and recommendations for rectification are made.
