

Title	Milk dairy cows and isolate milk unsuitable for collection

Purpose	<p>People credited with this unit standard are able to milk dairy cows; and isolate milk unsuitable for collection.</p> <p>This unit standard is for people who have responsibility for milking cows, without assistance, on dairy farms.</p>

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Explanatory notes

- 1 Legislation includes but is not limited to - Health and Safety in Employment Act 1992, Animal Products Act 1999, Animal Welfare Act 1999.
- 2 *On-farm quality management procedures* refer to the documented procedures for farm dairy hygiene practices, which must meet legislative and dairy company requirements. On-farm quality management procedures are available from all dairy companies.
- 3 *Cups* can also be referred to as clusters.

Outcomes and evidence requirements

Outcome 1

Milk dairy cows.

Evidence requirements

- 1.1 Cows are bailed quietly and smoothly.
- 1.2 Cows are checked and prepared for milking in accordance with milk processing company’s requirements.
- 1.3 Cows are cupped according to on-farm quality management procedures.

Range one of – circle, flick, cross over, block.
- 1.4 Cows are milked hygienically in accordance with on-farm quality management procedures.

- 1.5 Cups are changed and/or removed according to on-farm quality management procedures.

Outcome 2

Isolate milk unsuitable for collection.

Evidence requirements

- 2.1 Cows whose milk is unsuitable for collection are identified and/or isolated from the herd, and recorded in accordance with on-farm quality management procedures.
- 2.2 Hygiene practices are consistently followed when isolating milk in accordance with on-farm quality management procedures.
