Service information refers to technical information for a vehicle, machine, or product detailing operation; installation and servicing procedures; manufacturer instructions; technical terms and descriptions; and detailed illustrations.

Suitable tools and equipment refer to industry approved tools and equipment that are recognised within the industry as being the most suited to complete the task in a professional and competent manner with due regard to safe working practices.

5 For this unit standard, it is essential that the practical assessment evidence is obtained in a motorsport team environment.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Determine competition race vehicle preparation requirements and prepare site.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Instructions and procedures to prepare the vehicle are identified.
- 1.2 Individual team member tasks and job specifications are itemised on a check sheet and confirmed with the team manager.
- 1.3 Health, safety, security, and driving arrangements are identified.
- 1.4 The site is prepared to enable the preparation work to be carried out.
 - Range equipment and tooling prepared and checked, sufficient support materials available, work area cleaned, weather protection, spectator protection.

Outcome 2

Carry out preparation and maintenance of the competition race vehicle before, during, and after the event.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Components and systems are inspected for condition, function, and compliance.
- 2.2 Vehicle is race prepared.

Range includes but is not limited to – final tuning, fluid levels, cleaned, refuelled, tyres checked, electronic data recording systems prepared, panels secure.

- 2.3 Pit or workspace support functions are carried out in accordance with the team manager's instructions and to timelines established.
 - Range includes but is not limited to making vehicle safe and track worthy, replacing components, cleaning, completing checklists or documentation.
- 2.4 Tools and equipment are put away in designated places after use.
