- 2 Definitions

*Fish Serve* is the trading name of the company that provides administration services to the New Zealand commercial fishing industry. Information can be accessed from <u>https://www.fishserve.co.nz/</u>.

An Operator is the person who has lawful possession and control of the vessel because of ownership, lease, sublease, charter, subcharter, etc.

A Notified User is a person apart from the Operator, who can use the vessel. Annual Catch Entitlement (ACE) is the right to catch a certain amount of a fish stock during a fishing year.

*Workplace procedures* refer to the policies and procedures set out in a verbal or written form by the employer or organisation. Procedures must be consistent with current legislative requirements and manufacturer's recommendations or instructions where relevant.

- 1.4 Describe the requirements for the period of registration, carrying the fishing permit on board, the display of the certificate of registration, and landing fish.
- 1.5 Describe the process of cancellation of a fishing permit and deregistration of a fishing vessel.

### Outcome 2

Describe the process of acquiring ACE, associated catch restrictions, and non-compliance implications.

### **Performance criteria**

- 2.1 Describe the process of acquiring ACE.
- 2.2 Describe the catch restrictions associated with ACE.
  - Range voluntary, regulatory, seasonal, catch methods, minimum holding requirements.
- 2.3 Describe the implications of breaching the conditions of the fishing permit.

Range includes but is not limited to permit suspension.

Describe the process for the monthly balancing of ACE.

### Performance criteria

- 3.1 Describe the requirements for the permit holder to complete a Monthly Harvest Return (MHR).
  - Range includes but is not limited to the catch for the month, quota and non-quota stocks and date due.
- 3.2 Describe the process used by Fish Serve for balancing catch against ACE held, and provision of the Monthly Balance Report.

- 3.3 Describe the importance of checking data accuracy in the Monthly Balance Report.
- 3.4 Describe the implications of not holding sufficient ACE and the options available.

- 4.1 Describe the fishing year end dates.
- 4.2 Describe the process of closing the ACE registers.
