- 3 Definitions
Company requirements refer to instructions to staff on policy and procedures that are available in the workplace. These requirements may include – company policies and procedures, work instructions, product quality specifications and legislative requirements.
Service information may include – technical information for a vehicle, machine, or product detailing operation; installation and servicing procedures; manufacturer instructions; technical terms and descriptions; and detailed illustrations.
- 4 It is recommended that people hold credit for Unit 24023, *Demonstrate knowledge of methods and precautions when removing paint from vehicle body panel surfaces*, or demonstrate equivalent knowledge and skills before being assessed against this unit standard.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Remove paint from vehicle panels.

Range may include – sanding, using chemical paint stripper.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Paint to be removed is identified.
- 1.2 Adjacent panels, parts and working environment are protected against damage.
- Range may include – removed, masked; glass, plastics, mouldings, badges, grille, wipers, number plates, lights, hidden paintwork, panels.
- 1.3 Paint is removed from the surface ensuring the surface is clean and free of defects.
- Range includes but is not limited to no evidence of – moisture, paint, dirt, dust, oil, deep sanding scratches that may impair painting.
