- Definition

 Company procedures mean the documented methods for performing work activities and includes health and safety, environmental, and quality management requirements. They may refer to manuals, codes of practice, or policy statements.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Describe, assess, accept, and sort reusable goods for resource recovery.

Performance criteria

1.1 Sources of reusable goods are described in terms of local availability.

Range

sources include but are not limited to – households, resource recovery facilities, charity organisations, manufacturing waste; evidence is required for two reusable goods from each source.

1.2 Reusable goods from local sources are described in relation to actual and potential markets.

Range markets may be – local, national, international.

1.3 The assessment of goods for acceptance is described in accordance with company procedures.

Range types of goods acceptable at the workplace;

assessment includes but is not limited to – possible uses,

ownership of goods, repairs needed.

1.4 Reusable goods are accepted for resale in accordance with company procedures.

Range goods and resale may include but are not limited to – donations.

1.5 Any reject goods are identified and reasons for rejection are described in accordance with company procedures.

Range reasons for rejection may include but are not limited to –

contamination, below grade.

1.6 Reusable goods are moved to designated area and processed in accordance with company procedures.

Range processing may include but is not limited to – sorting, display for

reuse.
