### Outcomes and evidence requirements

#### Outcome 1

Handle bulls in a herd during mating.

#### Evidence requirements

- Care is demonstrated when moving the herd from paddock to yard when bulls are present in the herd.

Range examples – allow an escape route, carry a stick, do not place self between two bulls, position of self in relation to bull.
- Bulls are drafted out in accordance with on-farm procedures and supervisor's instructions.
- Fresh bulls are rotated in herd according to on-farm procedures and supervisor's instructions.
