Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Replace a broken post.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Remove existing broken material ensuring own safety, and without damage to galvanising on existing fence wires.
- 1.2 Install replacement post consistent with the existing fence design.
- 1.3 Replace and ram soil so that the post is secure.
- 1.4 Reattach wire matching existing wire spacings.

- 1.5 Tidy site by replacing turf and removing surplus materials.
- 1.6 Clean and store tools and equipment after use.

Outcome 2

Repair a broken wire.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Select wire type to match existing fence wire.
- 2.2 Finish joins to manufacturer's specifications and with no protrusions.
- Range figure of eight knot, reef knot, tex brown knot, crimp sleeve, in-line wire joiner;
evidence is required for at least three.
- 2.3 Tension wire consistent with existing fence wires.
- 2.4 Tidy site.
- 2.5 Clean and store tools and equipment after use.
