1 Definitions

Manufacturer's instructions refers to specifications and/or instructions provided by the manufacturer for the correct installation and operation of the product(s) provided by that manufacturer.

Industry practice refers to the ability to work under supervision, demonstrating knowledge that reflects the uniformity, finish quality and material economies currently accepted by the Building and Construction Industry Training Organisation's National Advisory Group for the concrete trade.

3 Legislation and regulations relevant to this unit standard include: Health and Safety in Employment Act 1992 and Health and Safety in Employment Regulations 1995.
