Purpose	<p>This unit standard is for people in the hairdressing industry who wish to develop skills in pincurling hair using a variety of techniques.</p> <p>People credited with this unit standard are able to: describe pincurls; pincurl hair using a variety of techniques; and complete follow-up actions.</p>

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Explanatory notes

- 1 Definitions**

Legislative requirements refer to the obligations of the employer and/or employee under the Health and Safety at Work Act 2015 and Health (Hairdressers) Regulations 1980.

Workplace requirements mean the practices prescribed by management as being the quality standards for client contact and work organisation for a particular salon.
- 2** In this unit standard all work must comply with legislative requirements and must ensure optimum hair condition and maximum client comfort at all times.
- 3** For outcome two, at least half a head of hair must be demonstrated. The remainder of hair must be moulded or placed.

Prepared hair includes analysis of hair including growth patterns.
- 4** Useful references for this unit standard include the *Employers' Training Manual*, and the *Training Record Book*. Outcomes and evidence requirements

Outcome 1

Describe pincurls.

Evidence requirements

- 1.1 The parts of a pincurl are described.
Range stem, base, curl.
- 1.2 The direction pincurls can be moulded is described.
Range clockwise, anti-clockwise.
- 1.3 Appropriate pincurl bases and placements are described.
Range triangle, rectangle, square.
- 1.4 Pincurl placements and their results are described in terms of their influence on finished styles.
Range no stem, short stem, long stem, barrel curl or stand up.

Outcome 2

Pincurl hair using a variety of techniques.

Range pincurls – no stem, short stem, long stem, barrel curl or stand up;
reverse pincurl setting pattern – clockwise, anti-clockwise.

Evidence requirements

- 2.1 Prepared hair is able to be pincurled from roots to ends.
Range hydrogen bonds broken.
- 2.2 Assembled tools match pincurling requirements.
- 2.3 Pincurling meets the style requirements.
Range style requirements may include – square bases, rectangular bases, triangular bases;
styles with stems must show no distortion or twisting and stems must be the correct length;
curls must show no distortion and the correct curl size must be produced.
- 2.4 Pincurls are secured using a technique that identifies the direction of the pincurl.
- 2.5 Moulded hair complements the curl pattern.

Outcome 3

Complete follow-up actions.

Evidence requirements

- 3.1 Tools and equipment are sanitised in accordance with workplace requirements.

3.2 The work area is cleaned and tidied in accordance with workplace requirements.

Range work area – shampoo area, styling station.
