

Demonstrate knowledge of the greyhound racing industry structure

Purpose This is a theory based unit standard for people who require background information on the greyhound racing industry, or to inform a decision on career choice within the industry.

People credited with this unit standard are able to demonstrate knowledge of the: national structure that governs greyhound racing within the New Zealand racing industry; the department structure that manages greyhound racing; Greyhound Racing New Zealand Rules of Racing and the New Zealand Greyhound; and roles of official staff on a greyhound raceday.

Elements and performance criteria

Element 1

Demonstrate knowledge of the national structure that governs greyhound racing within the New Zealand racing industry.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 The organisations that govern greyhound racing with the New Zealand racing industry are described in terms of their roles and functions.

Range Government, Minister of Racing, Judicial Control Authority, Totalisator Agency Board, New Zealand Racing Board.

Element 2

Demonstrate knowledge of the department structure that manages greyhound racing.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 The department structure that manages the greyhound industry is identified.

Range includes but is not limited to – Chief Executive Officer, Board Secretariat, Racing Manager, Training and Development Officer, Field Officers/Stewards, Racecourse Inspector, Stipendiary Stewards.

Element 3

Demonstrate knowledge of the Greyhound Racing New Zealand Rules of Racing and the New Zealand Greyhound.

Performance criteria

- 3.1 Description of the Greyhound Racing New Zealand Rules of Racing and Regulations identifies their function.

- 3.2 Description of the Greyhound Racing New Zealand Rules of Racing and Regulations identifies sources of advice for their interpretation.

Range staff and solicitors of Greyhound Racing New Zealand.

- 3.3 Description of the Greyhound Racing New Zealand Rules of Racing and Regulations identifies procedures to follow for the amendment of rules.

- 3.4 Description of the Greyhound Racing New Zealand Rules of Racing and Regulations identifies people who are bound by the rules.
- 3.5 Description of the Greyhound Racing New Zealand Rules of Racing and Regulations identifies forms available for the administration of the industry.
- 3.6 Description of the New Zealand Greyhound outlines its contents and function.

Element 4

Demonstrate knowledge of the roles of official staff on a greyhound raceday.

Performance criteria

- 4.1 Official staff for a greyhound raceday are described in terms of their roles.

Range Race Club secretary, Raceday Secretary, Racecourse Inspector, Stipendiary Steward, Field Officer/Steward, Assistance Stipendiary Steward, Judge, veterinarian, Swab Attendant, kennel officials, Lure Driver, Starter.

Please note
