*Design brief* – refers to the design parameters agreed between the kitchen designer and the client.
- 4 A concept design for a kitchen that has already been developed will be given to the candidate.

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### Outcomes and evidence requirements

#### Outcome 1

Demonstrate knowledge of cabinet construction, installation and maintenance for use in a kitchen design.

## Evidence requirements

- 1.1 Components of cabinet construction are identified and described in terms of their use for a kitchen design.
- Range components include but are not limited to – plinth, adjustable legs, rails, base, sides, backs, shelves.
- 1.2 Hardware used in cabinet construction is identified and described in terms of its use for a kitchen design.
- Range hardware includes but is not limited to – hinges, drawer runners, handles, interior mechanical fittings.
- 1.3 Materials used in the construction of cabinet components are identified and described in terms of their use for a kitchen design.
- Range materials include but are not limited to – medium density fibreboard, moisture resistant board, particle board.
- 1.4 Care and maintenance for different types of cabinet materials are identified in terms of a kitchen design.
- Range evidence of three different types of cabinet materials is required.
- 1.5 Cabinet installation requirements for incorporation in the supplied concept design are identified from the kitchen design brief.
