- 1.2 Identify issues to consider with regards to a re-roof project.
 - Range includes but is not limited to compliance requirements, insulation, material change, local body requirements.
- 1.3 Describe the requirements of a re-roofing project risk assessment.
 - Range includes but is not limited to brittle materials, asbestos, purlins that require re-screwing.
- 1.4 Describe site check activities in accordance with site procedures.
 - Range site preparation, health and safety checks and signs, site hazards.
- 1.5 Describe work planning sequence in terms of minimising impact to occupants and potential risks of exposure damage to house.
- 1.6 Explain the purpose of the work sheet, plan, or job schedule in terms of defining the work to be done and potential hazards.
- 1.7 Describe fastening length checks to ensure compatibility with existing structure.
- 1.8 Describe disposal planning for the removed roofing.

1.9 Explain the New Zealand Building Code compliance requirements for re-roofing in accordance with territorial authority requirements.

Outcome 2

Demonstrate knowledge of re-roofing procedures for metal roofs.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Describe the process of removing existing fixings and sheets.
- 2.2 Describe storage and handling requirements of existing and new roofing sheets.
- 2.3 Compare fastening methods suitable for re-roofing with new installations.
