- 2 Definitions

Finished items refer to items that are manufactured or produced in a marine or composite industry.

Industry expectations refer to the expectations an employer has of an employee, usually clearly outlined in a position description and/or workplace policies and procedures or equivalent.

Workplace policies and procedures refer to the documented procedures and policies providing guidelines of the tasks and activities carried out in the workplace. This typically includes relevant health and safety policies to manage risk in the workplace.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Explain the scope of work, materials, and sequencing used in a marine or composite workplace.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 The scope of work undertaken in a marine or composite workplace is explained in accordance with workplace policies and procedures.
- 1.2 Materials used are identified in terms of their applications in the marine or composite workplace.
- 1.3 Sequencing of own and others work is explained in terms of efficient workflows and workplace policies and procedures.

Outcome 2

Explain maintenance or warranty requirements for finished items in a marine or composite workplace.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Maintenance or warranty requirements for finished items are explained in accordance with workplace policies and procedures.

Outcome 3

Explain industry expectations of employees in a marine or composite workplace.

Performance criteria

- 3.1 Industry expectations of employees are explained in terms of maintaining workplace reputation, and safety in accordance with the Health and Safety at Work Act 2015.
