Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Prepare to use a brushwood chipper.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Wear personal protective equipment appropriate for the task.
- 1.2 Check brushwood chipper.
 - Range checks include but are not limited to safety features, roadworthiness – nothing is loose, fuel, coolant and hydraulic oil levels.
- 1.3 Select safe, suitable site to use brushwood chipper.
- 1.4 Prepare the brushwood chipper for use.

Outcome 2

Use a brushwood chipper.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Stack brushwood and make ready to chip.
- 2.2 Operate brushwood chipper safely and efficiently to chip brushwood.
- 2.3 Shut down brushwood chipper safely when task is completed.
 - Range includes but is not limited to clear the in-feed table before engine slows, bring brushwood chipper to a stop and turn engine off.

Outcome 3

Remove brushwood chipper from the site.

Performance criteria

- 3.1 Transport brushwood chipper off site.
- 3.2 Complete work and leave site in a condition that is in accordance with any contract specifications.
