1 Definitions

Enterprise procedures refer to the expected performance required by the enterprise in which credit for this unit standard is being sought. Outcome 1

Demonstrate knowledge of procedures for responding to security risks on board an aircraft.

Range may include but is not limited to – passenger behaviour, unaccompanied items, accompanied items, intoxicated persons.

Performance criteria

1.1 Assessment of potential security risk is conducted in accordance with enterprise procedures.

- 1.2 Investigation of the potential security risk is conducted with minimal disruption to passengers and in accordance with enterprise procedures.
- 1.3 Information and evidence of the investigation are communicated to relevant passengers and crew in accordance with enterprise procedures.

Outcome 2

Document and present the results of a security incident.

Performance criteria

2.1 Documentation and presentation of a security incident are carried out in accordance with enterprise procedures.
