Elements and performance criteria

Element 1

Demonstrate knowledge of rubberware used on herd testing equipment.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Rubberware is described in terms of the relationship between sizes and farmer equipment.
- 1.2 Rubberware is described in terms of the relationship between, and implications of, length or obstructions and vacuum.

Element 2

Demonstrate knowledge of milk meters used in herd testing.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Milk meters are described in relation to the way in which milk flows through the meter.
- 2.2 Milk meters are described in terms of their operation and set up.
- 2.3 Milk meters are described in terms of the implications of using incorrect rubberware size and set-up.
