Range may include but is not limited to – karakia Māori, other karakia in te reo Māori.

1.2 Karakia is recited correctly in a solo situation.

Outcome 2

Compose and present whaikorero to be used in a formal situation.

Range may include but is not limited to – tangihanga, pōwhiri, mihimihi; evidence of at least one is required.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Whaikōrero is composed in a manner ensuring that structure conforms to mihi whaikōrero ki ngā manuhiri.
 - Range including but is not limited to tauparapara, mihi ki te marae, mihi ki ngā mate, take whakamutunga.
- 2.2 Whaikōrero is presented correctly.

Outcome 3

Demonstrate use of whakataukī/whakatauākī.

Performance criteria

3.1 Use of whakataukī/whakatauākī is demonstrated in a manner that concurs with hapū and/or iwi tradition.

Range including but is not limited to – pepeha, whakataukī/whakatauākī.

Outcome 4

Perform waiata in a formal situation.

Range including but is not limited to – waiata whakangahau, waiata pōwhiri, waiata tangi, mōteatea, aoteatea; evidence of three waiata is required.

Performance criteria

- 4.1 Waiata is performed using correct rangi and kupu.
- 4.2 Waiata is explained according to type in a manner that concurs with hapū or iwi tradition.

Range including but is not limited to – waiata tangi, oriori, pātere, ngeri.
